IWEC International Limited is making a voluntary modern slavery and human trafficking statement relating to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

We oppose slavery and human trafficking in all its forms and make this statement to set out the steps we have taken to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our business or in our supply chains.

About us

We are a small, limited company providing electrical installation and maintenance services throughout the UK, based in South Wales.

Our annual turnover is under £36 million. Although we are not required to make a modern slavery statement under section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015, we are making this voluntary statement to show our commitment to ethical trading principles and to set out the steps we are taking to tackle modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and in our supply chains.

Our supply chains are mainly made up of electrical wholesalers and specialist contractors.

Our commitment to ethical trading

We are committed to ethical trading principles and to acquiring goods and services without harm to others.

Due diligence and risk assessment

To help identify and monitor the risk of slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain we include antislavery and human trafficking statements in our vetting processes to suppliers and sub contractor's to ensure that they are committed to ethical labour practices

We adopt a zero-tolerance policy to all aspects of modern slavery and we conduct our undertaking in an ethical manner, ensuring that;

- Employment is freely chosen
- Working conditions are safe and hygienic
- Child labour is not used
- Minimum wage is paid
- Working hours are not excessive
- · No discrimination is practiced
- No harsh or inhumane treatment is allowed
